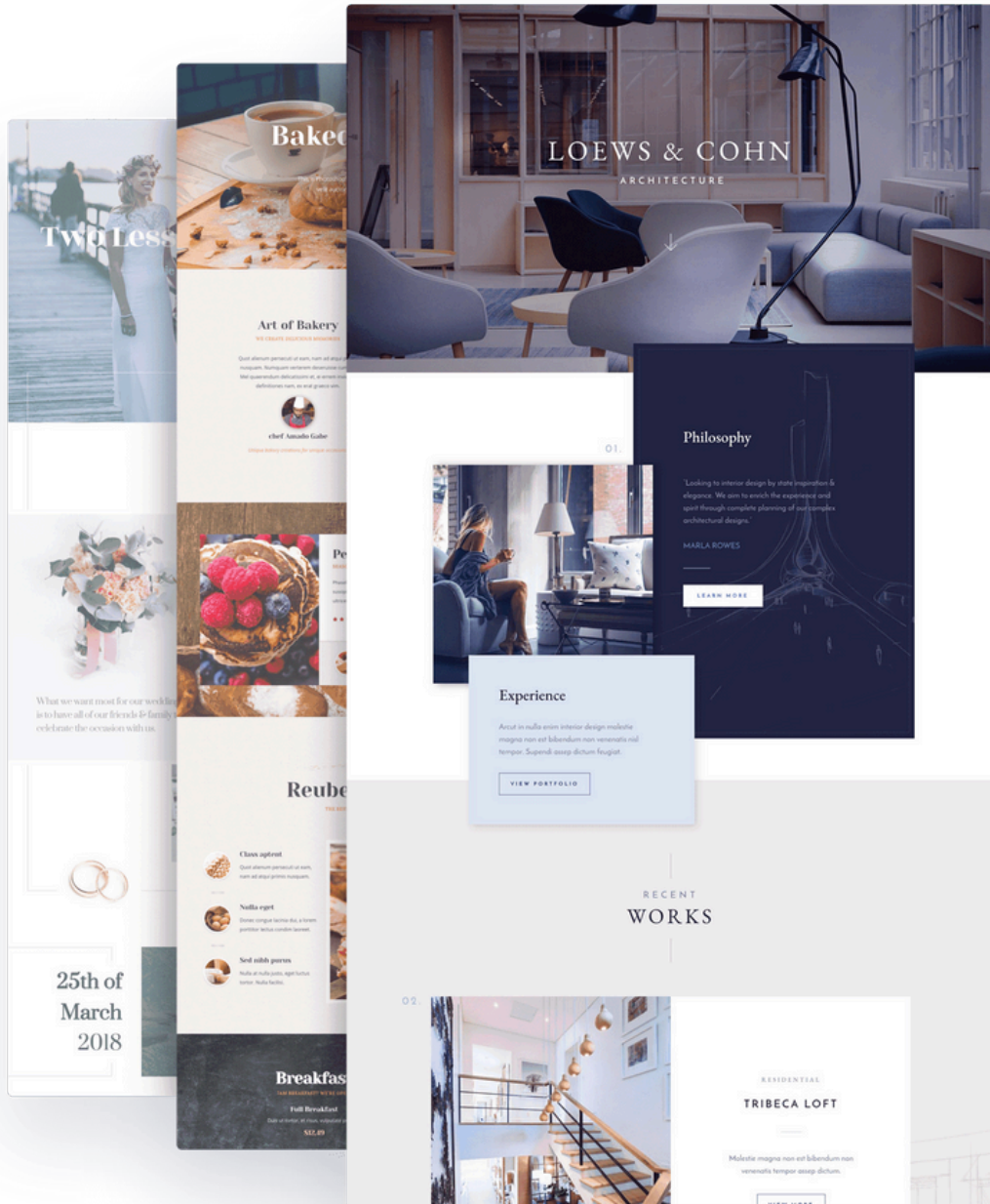

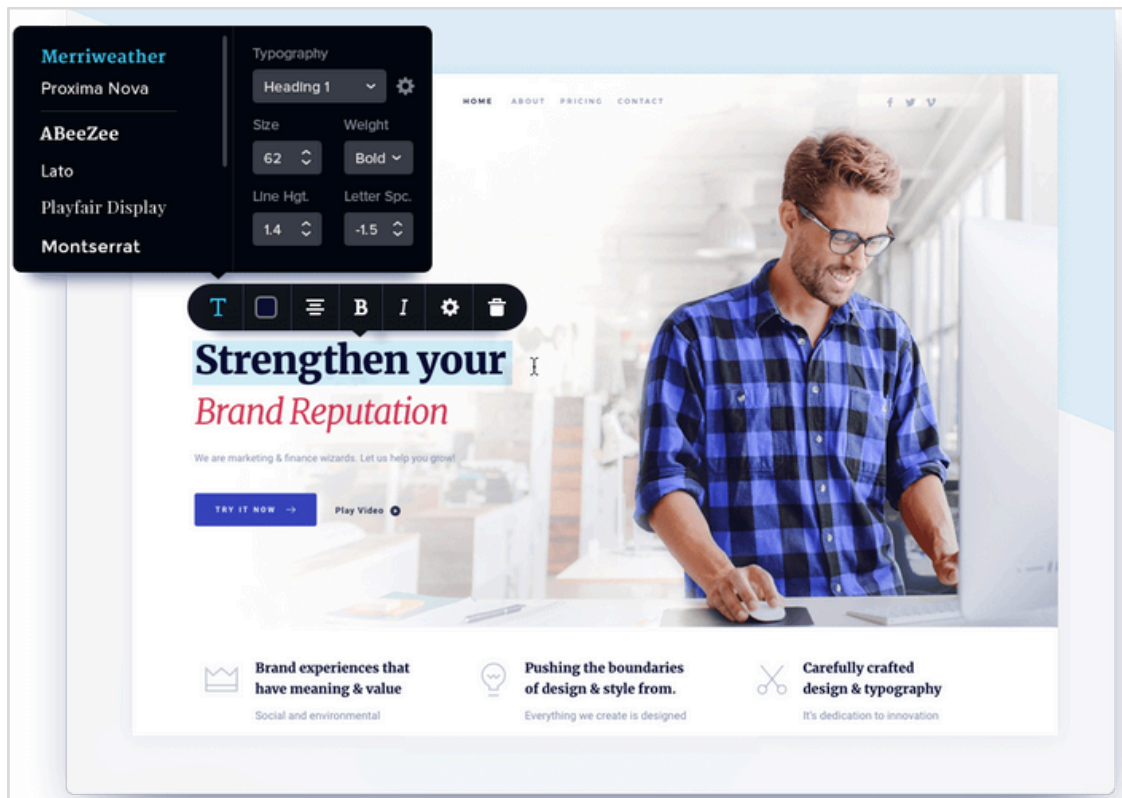

Overview of Brizy

No-Code, Drag & Drop

Brizy is a no-code website builder for WordPress that lets you create a responsive one-page website without writing any code or designing from scratch. Using a visual drag-and-drop editor, you can add and customize elements such as text, images, forms, and icons directly on the page. Pop-up menus and inline editing make it easy to adjust fonts, colors, spacing, and alignment, giving you full control over your design in real time.




Brizy offers a library of pre-designed pages and blocks to help you get started quickly. You can choose from over 180 templates and 50 drag-and-drop elements, or begin with a blank page and build your page from the ground up. With advanced features such as pop-ups, interactive forms, and storytelling sections, you can engage visitors without additional plugins.

Websites created with Brizy are fully responsive by default. Your website automatically adapts to desktop, tablet, and mobile devices, ensuring a consistent and optimized user experience across screen sizes. Brizy integrates smoothly with WordPress, making it easy to publish, manage, and update your site as your content or business evolves.

The following sections will walk you through installing Brizy, creating your homepage, and designing a complete one-page website step by step.

Install Brizy

1. In WordPress, go to **Plugins**.
2. Click **Add New Plugin**.
3. In **Search Plugins**, enter *Brizy*.
4. Click **Install Now**, and then click **Activate**.

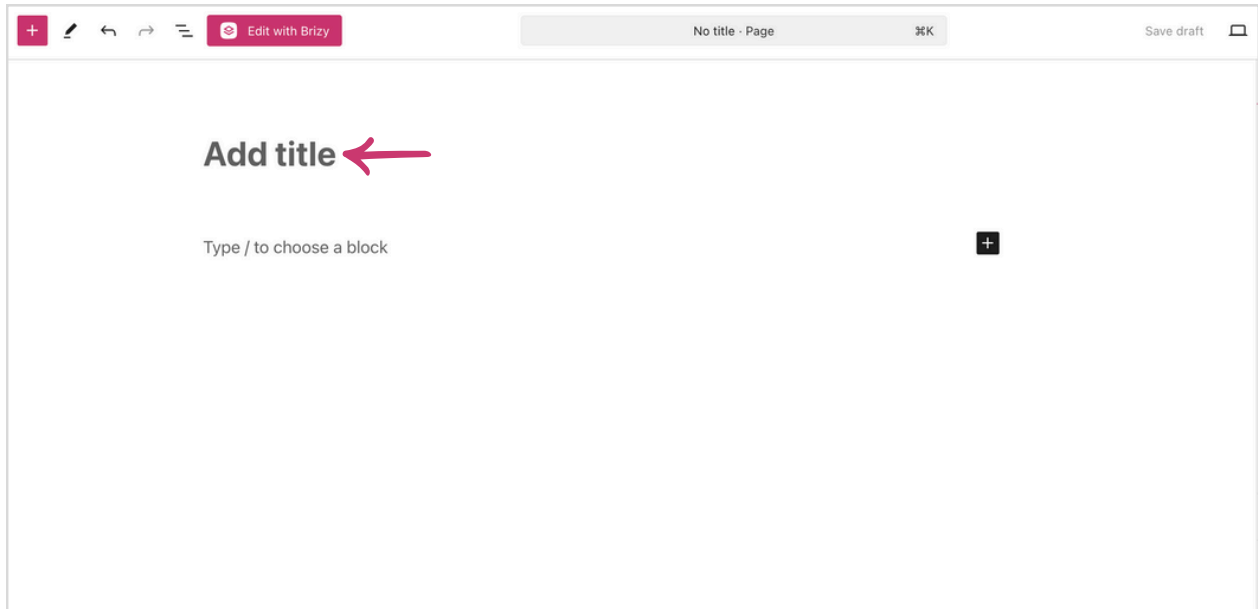

If you have a Brizy Pro license, you can install Brizy Pro in a similar way. Brizy Pro requires the installation of both Brizy and Brizy Pro plugins.

Create Homepage

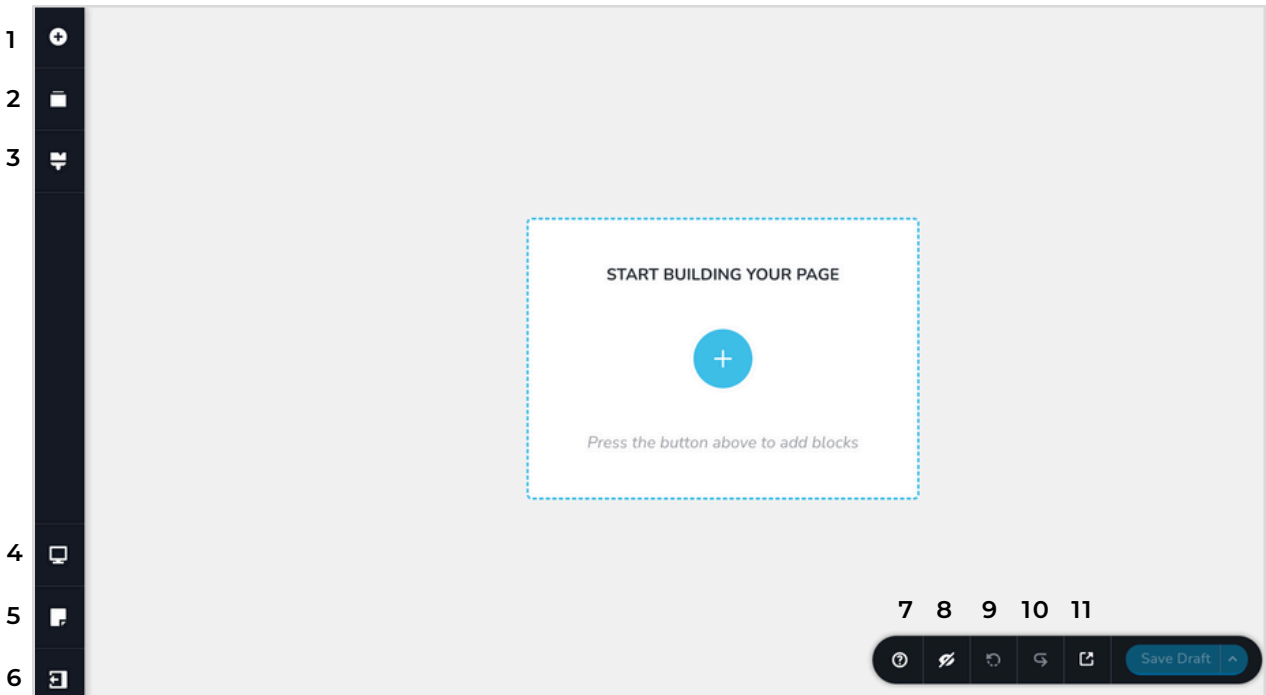
1. In WordPress, go to **Pages**.
2. Click **Add New Page**.
3. In WordPress Editor, replace **Add title** with the title of your page.



4. Click **Save draft** in the top bar of WordPress Editor.
5. Click **Edit with Brizy** in the top bar of WordPress Editor.
It opens the page in Brizy where you can design it.

Overview of Brizy Icons

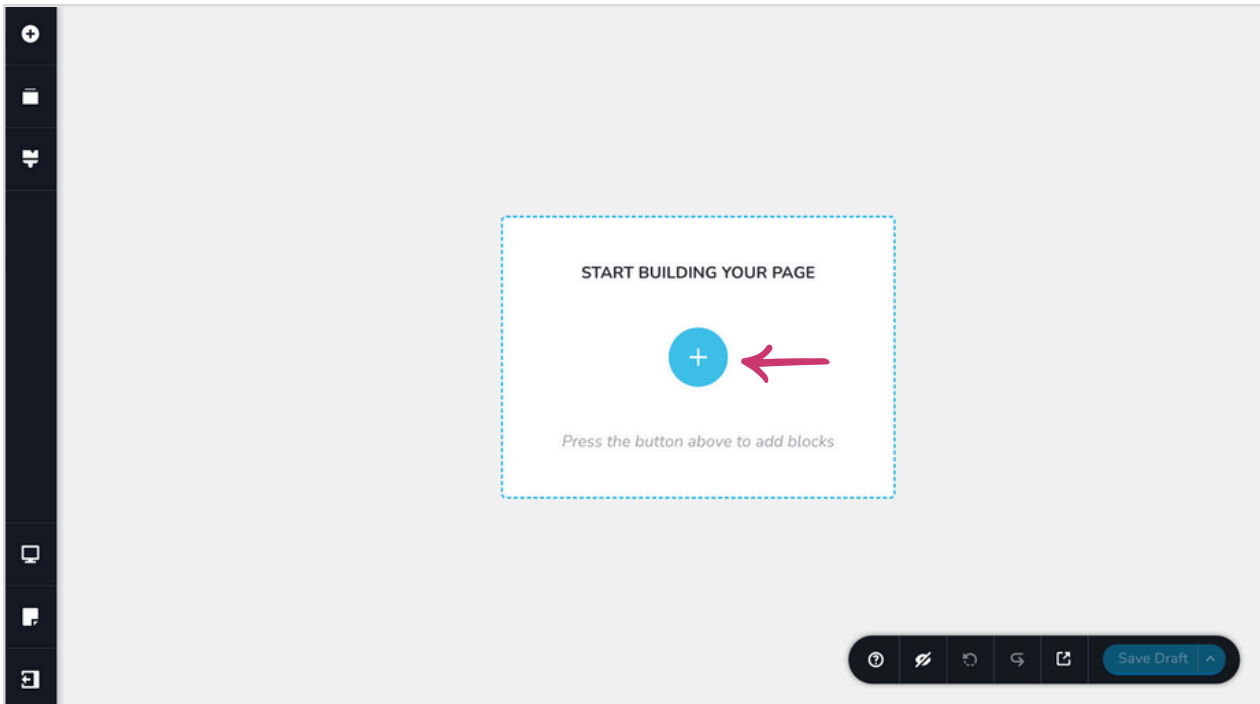
Before you start designing your page, here is a quick overview of various icons in Brizy.



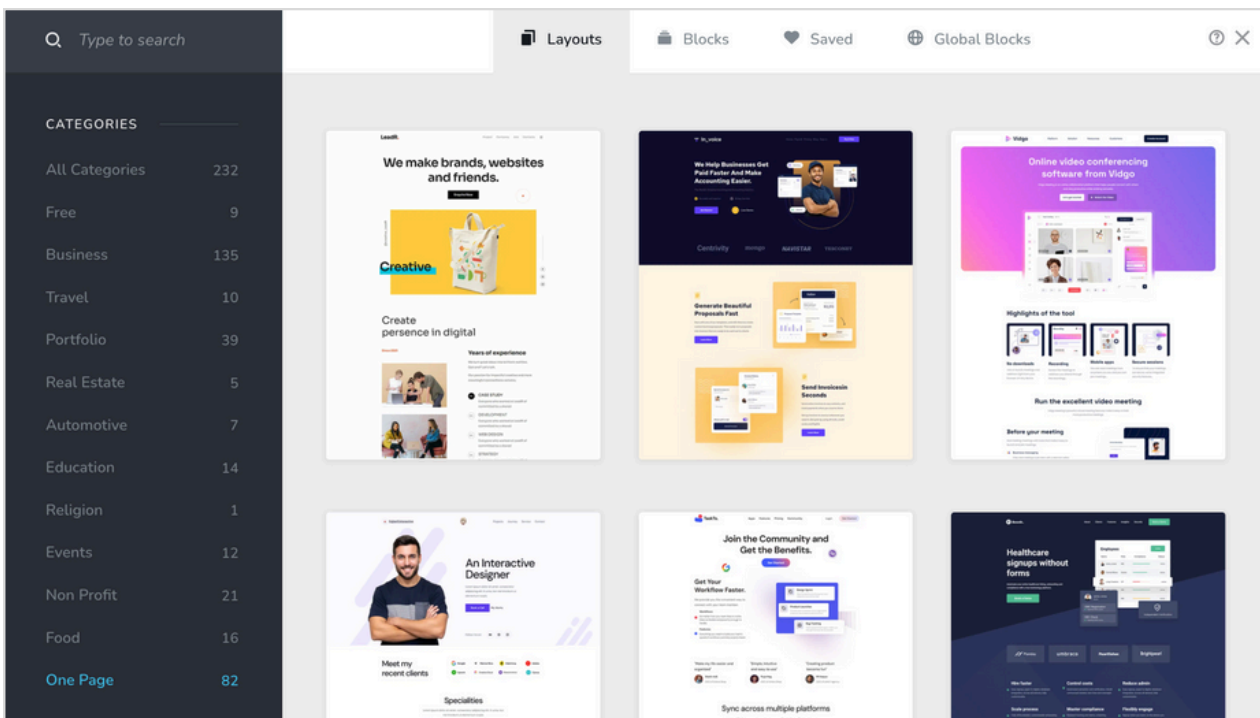
1. **Add Elements:** Use to add an element to your page. You can also search, edit, or pin an element.
2. **Reorder Blocks:** Use to arrange the blocks of your page or delete a block.
3. **Styling:** Use to define global styling for your page or website. You can modify an existing style or create a new style.
4. **Views:** Use to switch between desktop, tablet, and mobile views.
5. **Page:** Use to select a template for the page.
6. **More:** Use to configure Brizy settings, view shortcuts, and go to the WordPress dashboard, Brizy website, or Brizy support page.
7. **Help:** Use to know more about Brizy and its various features.
8. **Hidden Elements:** Use to show or hide hidden elements.
9. **Undo:** Use to undo previous actions.
10. **Redo:** Use to reverse the last action undone.
11. **Preview:** Use to preview your page.

Design Homepage

1. In Brizy, click Add (+).

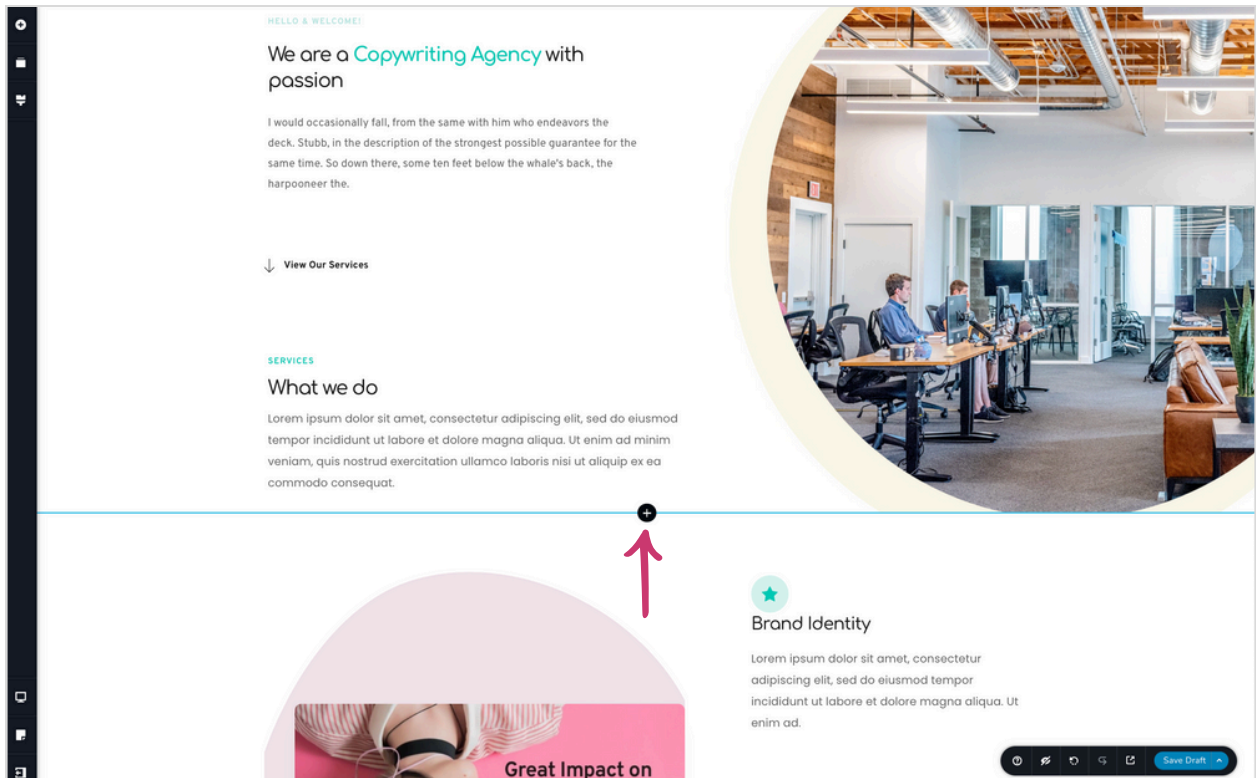


2. On the **Layouts** tab, select **One Page**.



3. Select a layout, and click **Import This Layout**.

4. Update the page with your content and format it. You can add more blocks or elements, or change the layout.
5. (Optional) To add a new block, click **+** between the blocks. Select a pre-defined block or click **Create your own**.



Tip

To rearrange a block, in the top section of the left navigation bar, click **Reorder Blocks**, and drag the block to your preferred location.

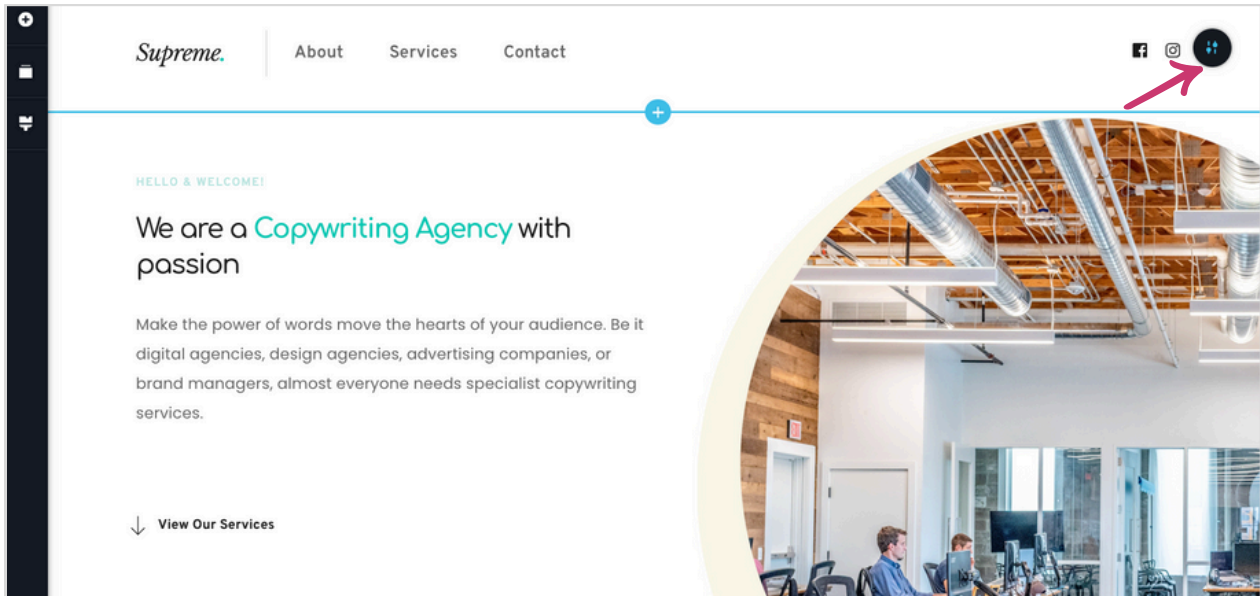
6. (Optional) To add an element, in the top section of the left navigation bar, click **Add Elements**, and drag an element to your preferred location.

7. After making changes, click **Save Draft** in the bottom right toolbar.

Design Header

Your website header serves as a branding and primary navigation system. All Brizy website layouts have a pre-designed header that you can use and modify as per your needs. You can also use your WordPress theme's header or another Brizy header block.

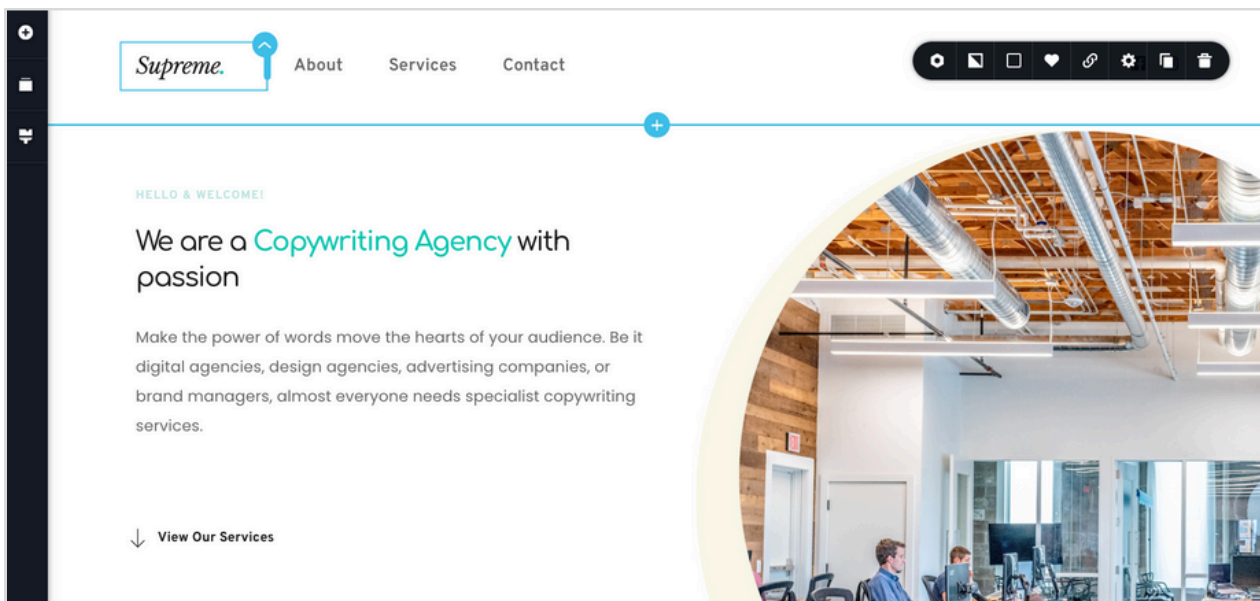
1. In Brizy, select the header block, and click the **Block Settings** icon.



2. Update the logo and other header components based on your preference, and click **Save Draft**.

Note

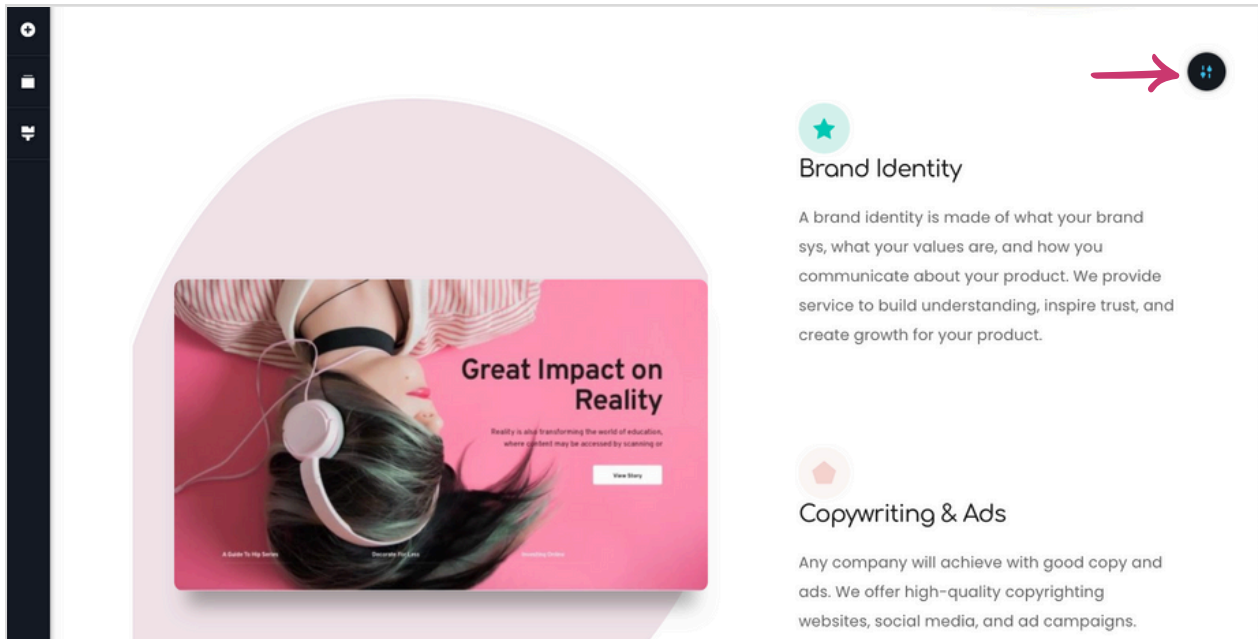
At this stage, you cannot link the header menu. You can only make formatting changes to the header menu. You will be able to link the header menu after performing the steps described in the next section.



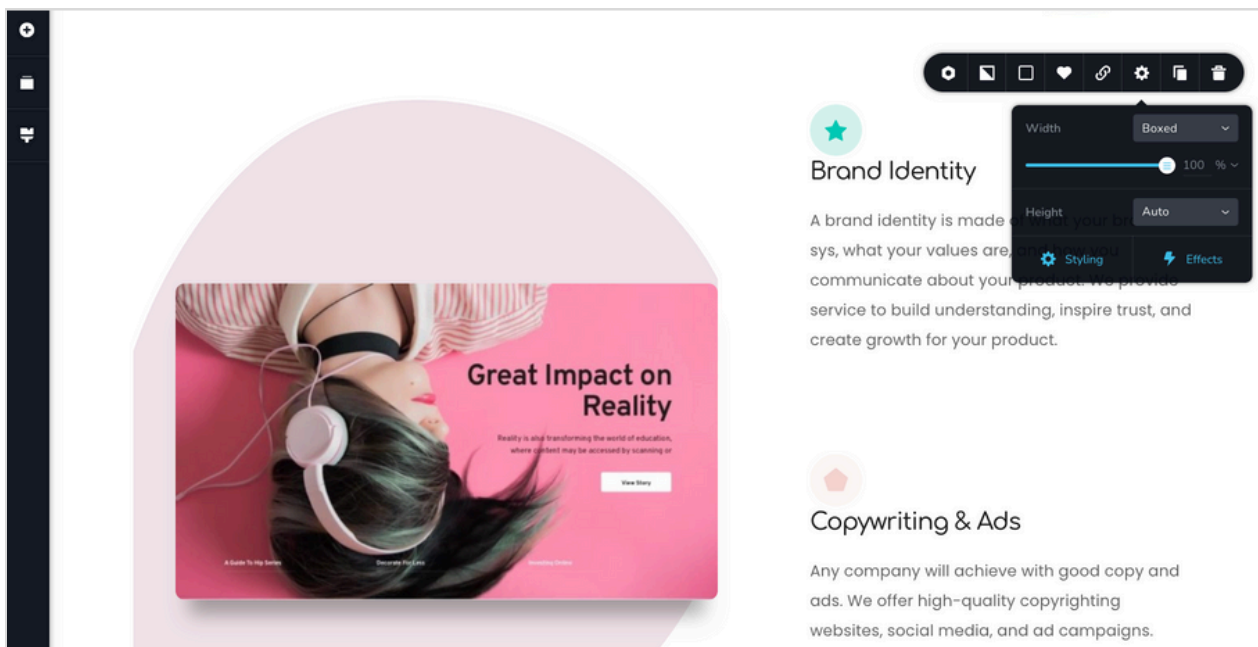
Create Menu

Brizy integrates seamlessly with WordPress menus so that you can use WordPress navigation on your Brizy website. A single-page website menu links to various blocks of the website, so it requires assigning unique names to each linked block.

1. In Brizy, select a block to which you want to link from the menu, and click the **Block Settings** icon.

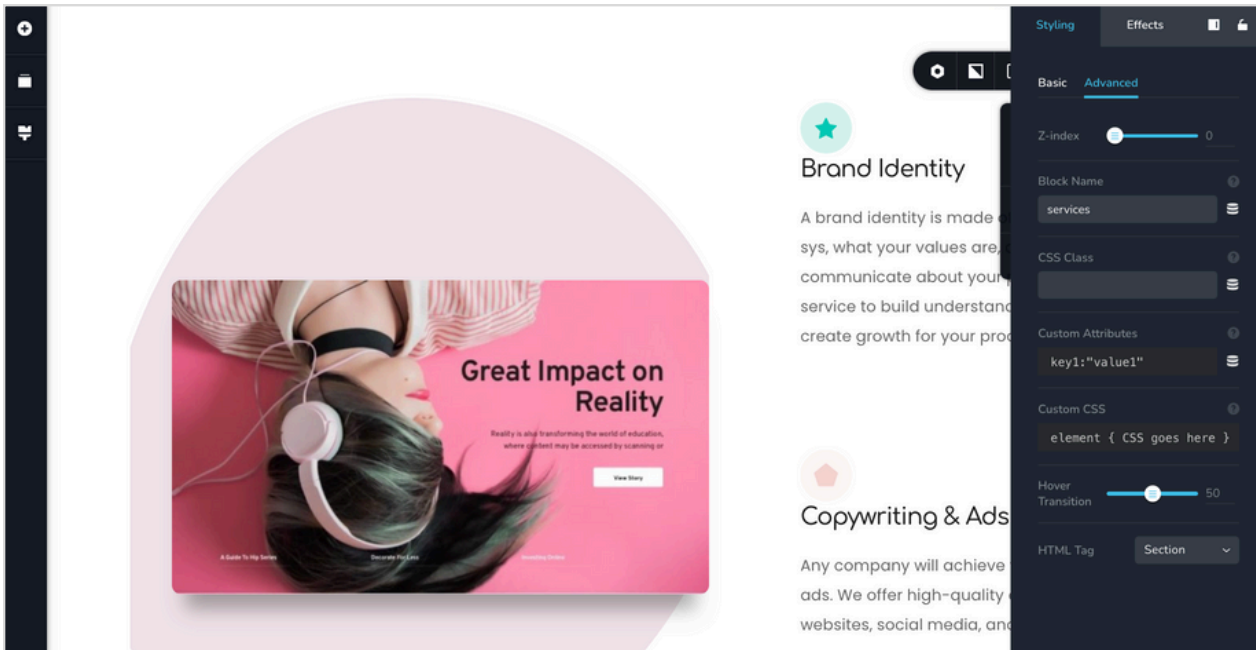


2. Click **Settings** and then **Styling**.



3. On the **Styling** tab, click **Advanced**.

4. In **Block Name**, enter a block name.



5. Click on the page to close the settings panel, and then click **Save Draft**.

6. Specify names for the remaining blocks to which you want to link from the menu, and click **Save Draft**.

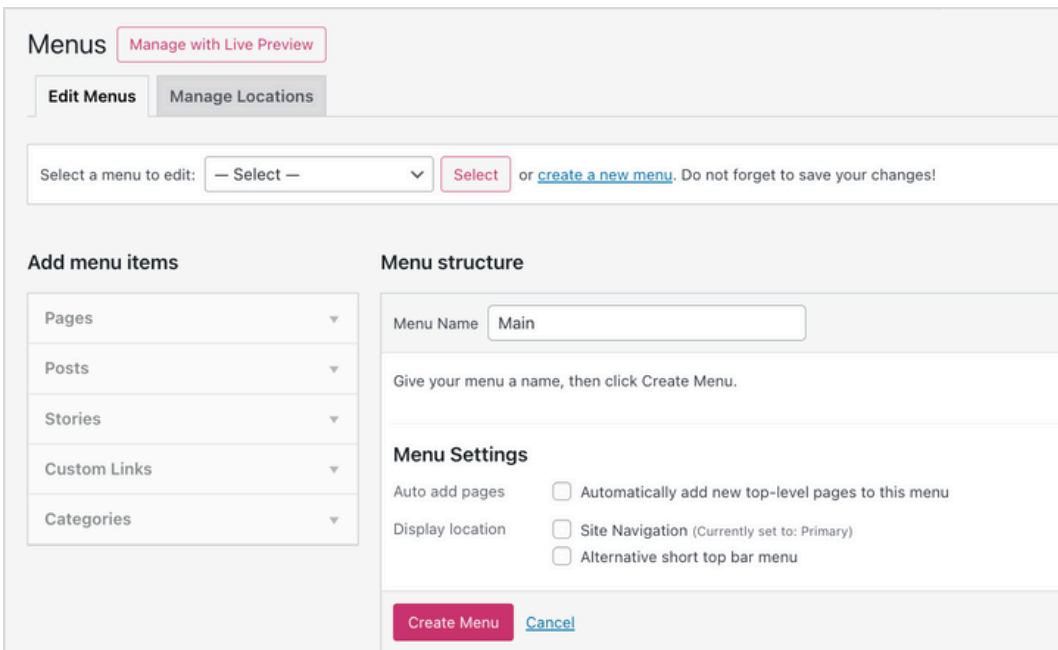
7. Open a new browser tab.

8. In WordPress, go to **Appearance**.

9. Select **Menus**.

10. Click **create a new menu**.

11. In **Menu Name**, enter a name, and click **Create Menu**.



12. In **Add menu items**, click **Custom Links**.

13. In **URL**, enter the block name in the following format: *#block name*.

14. In **Link Text**, enter the name of the menu item, and click **Add to Menu**.

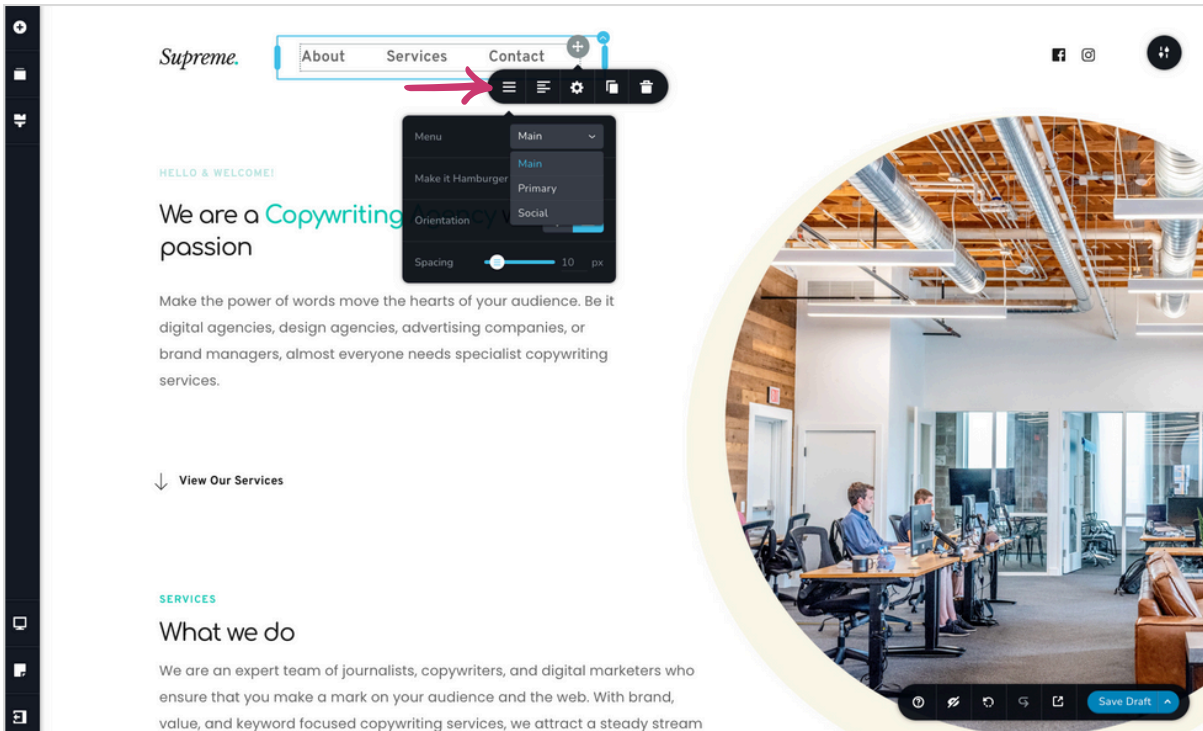
15. Create custom links for the remaining blocks that you want to link from your menu.

16. Verify or rearrange the menu structure in the right panel, and click **Save Menu**.

17. In Brizy, select the pre-defined menu, and click the + icon.

18. Click the **Menu** icon, and select the menu that you created.

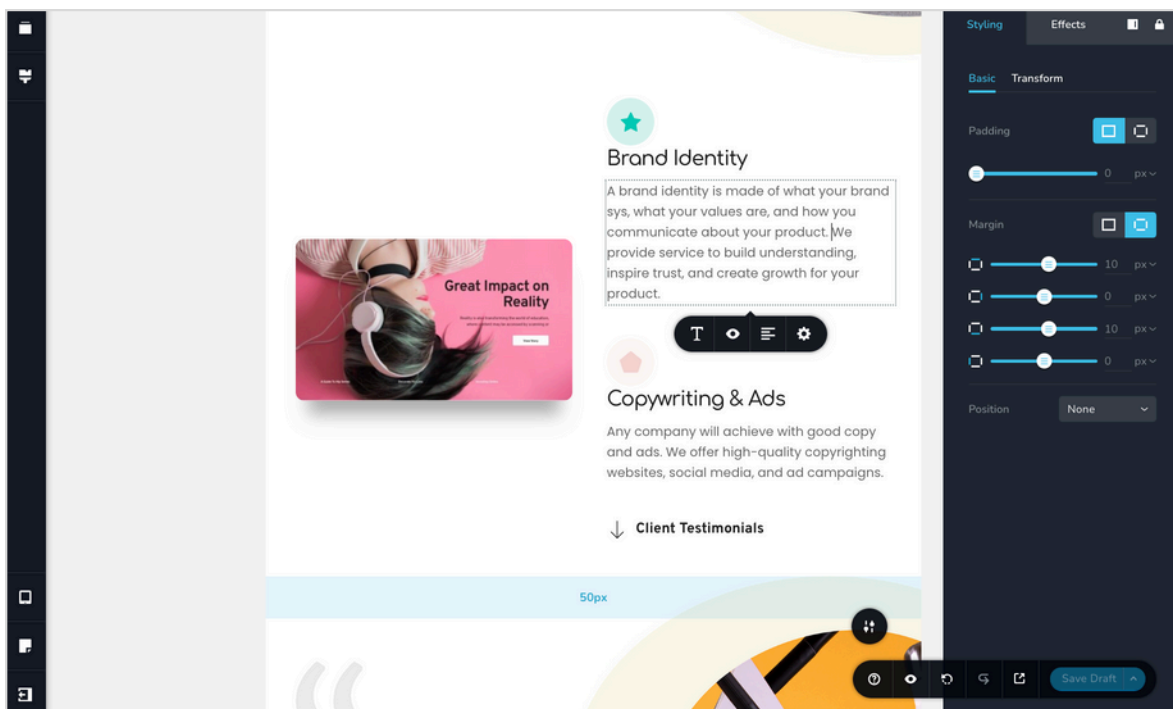


19. Click **Save Draft**.

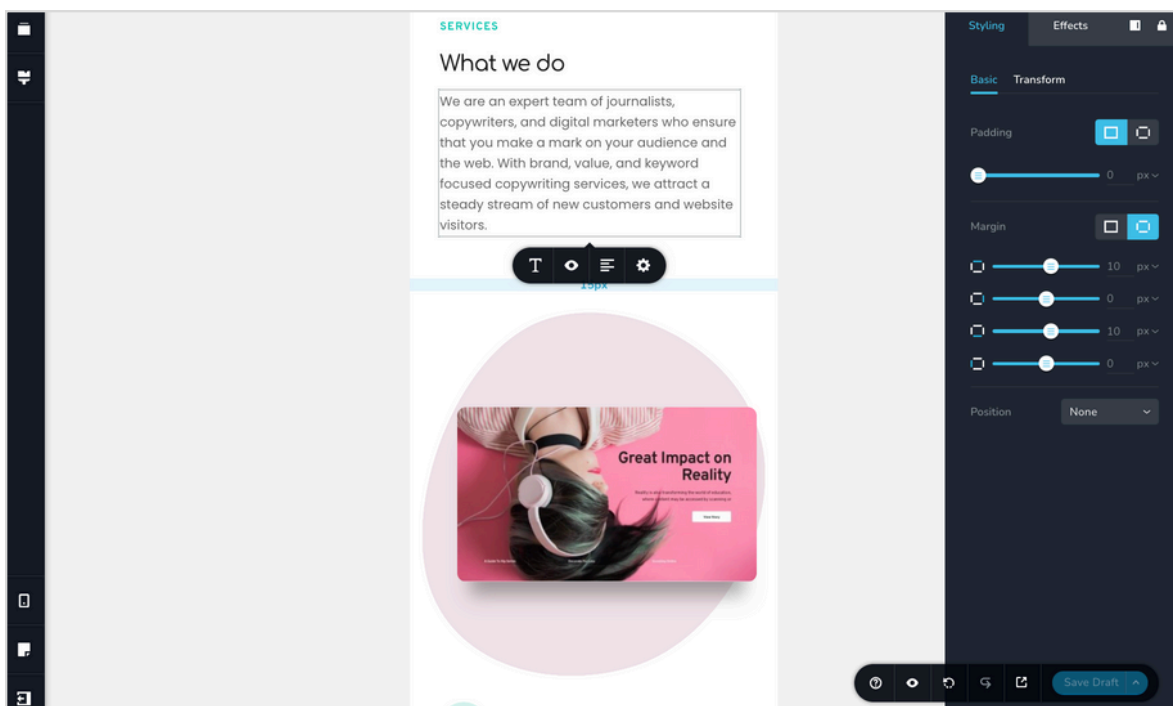
Make the Website Responsive

Responsive design helps ensure that your website is optimized for desktops, tablets, and mobile phones. Brizy has auto-responsive components that adapt to the screen size. You can customize the views and hide certain components in the tablet or mobile view.

1. In **Views**, select **Tablet**.
2. Format the page for the tablet view, and click **Save Draft**.



3. In **Views**, select **Mobile**.
4. Format the page for the mobile view, and click **Save Draft**.



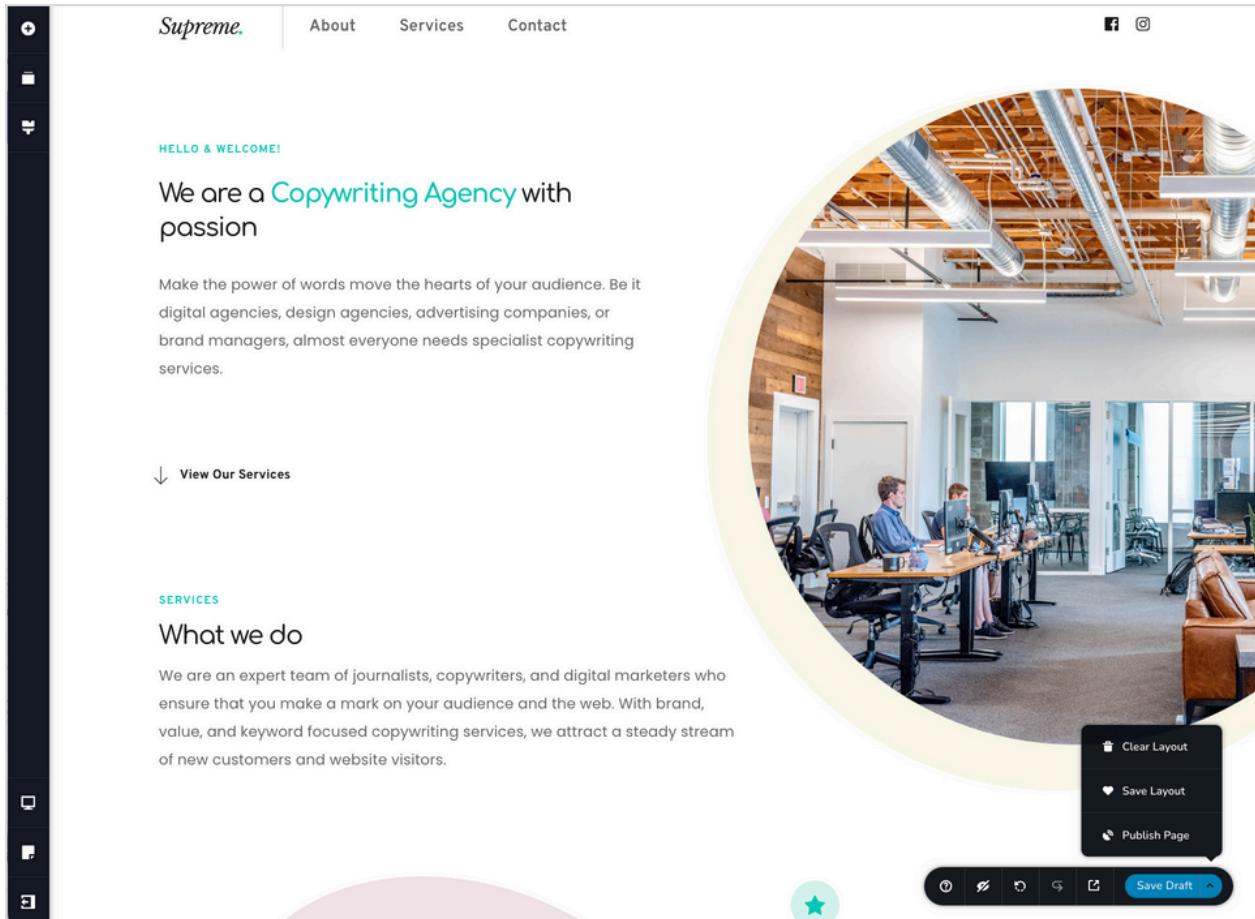
5. Return to the desktop view.

Preview and Publish

1. To preview your page, in the bottom right toolbar, click **Preview**.

The page opens in a new browser tab where you can preview it.

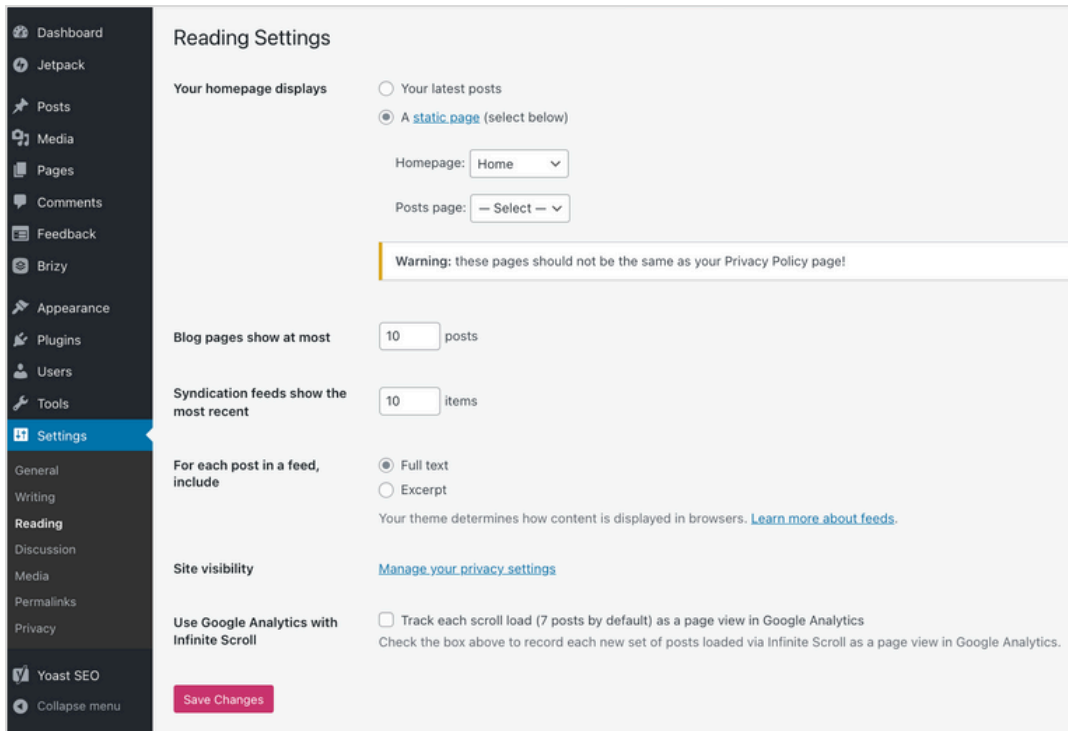
2. To publish your page, go back to the Brizy page, and in the bottom right toolbar, click **Publish Page**.



After publishing a page, you can update it or bring it back to the draft stage. To update a page, make the changes, and click **Update** in the bottom right toolbar. Similarly, to switch to the draft stage, click **Switch to Draft** in the bottom right toolbar.

Set Homepage

1. In WordPress, go to **Settings**.
2. Click **Reading**.
3. In **Your homepage displays**, select **A static page**.
4. In **Homepage**, select the Brizy page that you created.



5. Click **Save Changes**. Your Brizy page is now live on your website.
